


How to use Forums

The **Forum** is an activity where students and teachers can exchange ideas by posting comments. A forum can contribute significantly to successful communication and community building in an online environment. Open your course and choose the Forum that you want to use and click on it. To add a discussion topic, click Add a new discussion topic

Type in the **Subject** and content of the **Message**. Try to keep both brief and worded in a way that allows students to understand what the topic is about. Scroll to the bottom of the page and click Post to forum



You will now see a message advising you have 30 minutes to edit or delete your post. After 30 minutes, your post will be emailed to everyone who is subscribed to this forum¹.

If you want to reply to a message in a Forum, click the **Discussion** topic to view the original posting and all its replies. Scroll down to








How to use Forums

Type your reply in the **Message** area. Only change the subject if you intend to discuss something different. When you have finished typing your message, click Post to forum



Again, you will see a message giving you 30 minutes to edit the content of your post or delete your post. After 30 minutes, your post will be emailed to everyone who is subscribed¹ to this forum.

Note 1: Subscriptions

If you are subscribed to a Forum, it means you will receive email copies of Forum posts. Depending on how the Forum has been set up, *either* participants will be able to choose whether to be subscribed *or* the subscription is forced so that everyone receives email copies of forum posts.
